



He is member of the German National Academy of Science Leopoldina and Chair of the Sepsis-Foundation. Professor Jean-Louis Teboul is a highly esteemed figure in the field of Therapeutics and Intensive Care Medicine. Born on December 7, 1953, in Algiers, Algeria, he has made significant contributions to the medical field over the course of his illustrious career. He graduated with a Medical Degree (MD) in 1985 from the Faculty of Medicine Cochin-Port Royal at the University of Paris V, after completing his undergraduate studies from 1973 to 1979. His postgraduate training began with a residency in internal medicine, cardiology, and intensive care medicine between 1981 and 1985, followed by a fellowship in Intensive Care Medicine.

Professor Teboul's academic career spans several decades, with notable milestones including his appointment as Associate Professor of Therapeutics and Intensive Care Medicine at Bicêtre Hospital (Paris-South University) from 1993 to 1997. He served as a Professor of Therapeutics and Intensive Care Medicine at Bicêtre Hospital (Paris-Saclay University) from September 1997 until August 2023, and was Head of the Medical ICU from September 2020 to August 2023. In 2023, he was honored with the title of Professor Emeritus at Paris-Saclay University.

He holds several board certifications, including Therapeutic Trials Methodology (University Paris VII), Cardiology (1985), Medical Intensive Care (1989), Echocardiography (University Paris XII, 1987), and a PhD in Cardiorespiratory Physiology and Pathophysiology from the University Paris V in 1995. His expertise in cardiorespiratory physiology has led him to develop innovative techniques for assessing volume status and fluid responsiveness, including pulse pressure variation (PPV), passive leg raising (PLR), and end-expiratory occlusion tests. His research has focused extensively on cardiopulmonary interactions and the use of vasopressors and inotropes in critically ill patients.

Professor Teboul is a key member of multiple prestigious professional societies. He has been actively involved in the European Society of Intensive Care Medicine (ESICM) and the Société de Réanimation de Langue Française, where he has held executive roles, including General Secretary and Chair of several sections. Additionally, he has contributed significantly to the American Thoracic Society and the American College of Chest Physicians, for which he was awarded Honorary Fellow status in 2007.

As an academic leader, Professor Teboul has contributed to numerous journals, serving as the Editor-in-Chief of Annals of Intensive Care since 2011 and co-editor of Journal of Intensive Medicine since 2020. His research work is widely recognized, with 365 published articles indexed in PubMed and 160 book chapters. He has an H-index of 93 according to Google Scholar and has been invited to lecture at over 1,278 conferences worldwide, including 1,087 international lectures in English.

In addition to his research and academic achievements, Professor Teboul has received several prestigious awards. Notably, he was honored with the Society Medal by ESICM in 2024 and the International Honorary Membership of the Indian Society of Critical Care Medicine in 2024. He has held visiting professor positions at institutions such as Shanghai Jiao Tong University (2019-2022) and Sun Yat-sen University in Guangzhou, China (2023).

Professor Teboul's exceptional contributions to intensive care medicine, his profound research expertise, and his leadership in various scientific communities have earned him a distinguished place among the leading figures in his field.
